## Swimming Taranaki Inc For the year ended 30

April 2019

### Basis of Preparation

Swimming Taranaki is an Incorporated Society. The entity has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual operating expenses equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

### Revenue

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the society and revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received. The following specific recognition criteria must be met before revenue is recognised.

### Donations, fundraising and other similar revenue

Donations are recognised as revenue upon receipt.

Grant revenue includes grants given by other charitable organisations, philanthropic organisations and businesses. Grant revenue is recognised when the conditions attached to the grant has been complied with. Where there are unfilled conditions attaching to the grant, the amount relating to the unfulfilled condition is recognised as a liability and released to income as the conditions are fulfilled.

Revenue from legacies and estates that satisfies the definition of an asset is recognised as revenue when it is probable that future economic benefits or service potential will flow to the entity, and the fair value can be measured reliably.

### Interest Revenue

Interest revenue is recognised as it accrues, using the effective interest method.

### Income Tax

Swimming Taranaki Inc is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

### Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

### Receivables

Receivables are stated at their estimated realisable value. Bad debts are written off in the year in which they are identified.

### Plant, Property and Equipment

Plant, property and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and any impairment losses. Cost included expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the asset.

Statement of Accounting Policies

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### Going Concern

These financial statements have been prepared on the basis that the trust is a going concern.

### Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies during the financial year. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous reporting period.

# SWIMMING TARANAKI CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT 2018-2019

It is with pleasure I present the 2018/2019 Chair report. Swimming in Taranaki is in a great place. All the information in this report is a testament to that.

The swimmers are making the region proud and we are "The Best Performing Region" per capita in New Zealand. Congratulations to each and every swimmer for setting their goals, working hard and aiming to achieve.

All credit to the coaches for the countless hours they spend preparing and developing programs for the swimmers and then the hours spent on the pool deck. You are appreciated.

To the parents and volunteers, swimming is a sport that needs a significant input on boards, officiating, team managing, and fundraising not to mention transport to and from training. It is fantastic to see so many parents taking the first step on the officiating pathway and thanks to Cath Tippet and Rowan Williams for encouraging and upskilling the parents. It is incredibly important to see parents progress through to referee status. If it hadn't been for the parents of "retired" swimmers officiating at the recent Winter Champs we wouldn't have had a meet. Succession planning is vital.

I thank the Swimming Taranaki Board members for their work this year. Swimming New Zealand has recently reviewed its constitutions and the regional one is aligned with this. Sound governance is critical moving forward.

We are incredibly lucky to have an amazing administration talent in Tania, who has learnt so much in her first year, never afraid to ask and is developing good relationships with swimming NZ, other regional administrators, local clubs, coaches and parents. With her increasing expertise, this allows the board activities to revolve around governance, strategic planning and new initiatives rather than spending time on operational matters.

The board have spent this year developing a new strategic plan around;

"Our Members" to support and retain swimmers, coaches, officials and volunteers

"Key relationships" with Swimming NZ, our Aquaknights regions, clubs, coaches and the community

"Sound Governance" a sustainable, well organised and efficient organisation

Swimming NZ constitutionally requires regional associations to work together to facilitate competitive swimming and part of that is to deliver Regional Long and Short course Championships annually.

Since 2006 Swimming Taranaki have been part of Central Swimming working with Swimming Waikato, Swimming Bay of Plenty and Swimming Hawkes Bay/Poverty Bay. We were envied by the other regions for this structure, which created a competition plan and swimmer and coach development pathways. In 2013 Central Swimming became the Aquaknights zone. In the last few years differences of opinions have led to Central swimming becoming a dysfunctional unit and firstly Waikato then Swimming Taranaki and Swimming Hawkes bay Poverty Bay withdrew from the incorporated society that had been set up. This culminated in Waikato refusing to hold the planned long course championships in March 2019, replacing it with a Waikato meet. A coach led

initiative was thus set up to manage the 2 championship meets, the Tri-series competition and the Victorian Age Group championships team. The Board are working with the other regions to re-establish a structure to support the Aquaknights zone as required under the constitution, with the Board, regional administrators and coaches working together to enable this.

Another goal this year was to look at how the board could support our smaller clubs who have club rather than competitive swimmers. These clubs have an important role in swimming providing opportunities for swimmers to develop their skills and start on the competitive pathway if they so choose. We are hoping to run a new competition, the Interclub Challenge, over the summer months in 2020. By doing so we hope to increase competitive swimming numbers, particularly in South Taranaki.

As a sport, as well as the development of swimming skills for safety in the water and progressing to competitive swimming we also must also ensure our swimmers grow as people. It saddens me to see the high level of mental health issues in our youth and swimmers are no exception. Somewhere in the last decade resilience has been lost, and a sense of entitlement has developed, social media is part of the problem.

Swimming Taranaki's new values are

Excellence  
Teamwork  
Leadership  
Integrity  
Respect

If we can develop a culture throughout our organisation from the board level down which supports these values then we can assist our swimmers in their personal growth. Developing integrity, being trustworthy, honest and kind and showing respect to those around us, making good choices, speaking up for what is right and learning self-respect is crucial for personal development. Developing policies to allow the swimmers to give back to those that support them, the coaches, clubs and region while on the swimming pathway is part of that process also.

I had been planning staying on the committee another term but priorities for me have changed. I know Tania and the new board will continue to work towards positive outcomes for our members, enhance key relationships with sound governance and act to fulfil our vision for swimming in the region.

## 12 & Under Championships December 2018

We had 90 competitors this year made up of 67 Taranaki swimmers and 23 from visiting clubs. Our entry numbers increased from last year. ## COACHING ADVISORS REPORT 2018-2019

Another busy year has just been completed for Taranaki swimming with our swimmers competing locally, regionally, nationally and internationally and with great success.

As usual our year began with successful Taranaki swim camps being held in Stratford for our senior and intermediate level swimmers. This year we hosted a group of Rotorua swimmers in the senior group which helped our own swimmers train harder for the week. These camps are a most important toll for both swimmers and coaches to get together and learn from each other.

Following on from this we had Zac Reid compete for NZ at the Junior Pan pacific Games in Fiji, he placed 4<sup>th</sup> in the Men's 200 free in a TR record time of 1.49.35.

During October Lucy North and Emma North (Aquabladz) represented NZ at the Australian State Teams meet as part of a 40 strong New Zealand team. This was a first time selection for both girls onto a NZ team.

Also in October Zac Reid was part of a four strong swim team selected for the Youth Olympic Games in Buenos Aries. He placed 8<sup>th</sup> in the final of the 800 free and 9<sup>th</sup> in the 400m free. He has subsequently earned selection to the World Swimming Championships in July 2019 at the recent Swimming NZ trials winning 3 national open titles this year in the 400, 800 and 1500 freestyle.

Zac also broke Danyon Loader's 800m free 18 years NZ SC record in August 2018.

Taranaki swimmers acquitted themselves well at all the National meets this season with numerous medals and TR records set ( these are listed elsewhere) at SC Champs, Open Water, Juniors, Nags, Div 2 and Opens.

Erin Metcalfe, Brayden Meuli and Emma North earned selection to the State Teams selection camp based on their performances at Nags and Erin subsequently was selected for the 2019NZ State Team to be held in Canberra in October.

Finally I would like to thank the other members of our coaching panel for always being available to help forge a better Taranaki Swimming Calendar and program.

2018/2019 season has been very successful for Aquabladz Swimming Club.

### **International**

We had 4 swimmers selected for New Zealand teams with Zac Reid attending Junior Pan Pacific Champs in August and also the Youth Olympic Games in October. Both Lucy North and Emma North attended the Australian State Champs in October and Charlotte Webby competed at the Pan Pacific Champs held in Tokyo in August last year.

### **National**

Our teams attending the National Meets also stepped up, representing our club with pride and achieving great results along the way.

The New Zealand Short Course Champs was held in October and our team of 8 swimmers brought home 5 Gold, 6 Silver and 7 Bronze Medals and placed 11<sup>th</sup> club overall out of more than 60 teams entered.

New Zealand Open Water Championships was held in January and we had 2 swimmers represent Aquabladz, with Charlotte Webby winning the Female 10km event and Sophia Taylor winning the Female 7.5km event, and placing 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 15-17 women's 5km event.

NZ Junior Festival – Aquaknights was held in February and we had a team of 14 swimmers represent the club. Our team placed 3<sup>rd</sup> club overall bringing home 5 Gold, 7 Silver and 11 Bronze Medals.

New Zealand Division II Champs was held in Dunedin in March. We had a team of 12 swimmers attend this event. Again our team placed 3<sup>rd</sup> club overall out of more than 85 teams entered. These swimmers came home with 8 Gold, 7 Silver and 8 Bronze Medals.

NZ National Age Group Champs was held in Wellington in April. We had a team of 10 swimmers attend this event. Our team placed 15<sup>th</sup> this year from approximately 80 teams and came home with 1 Gold, 3 Silver and 3 Bronze Medals.

NZ Open Champs was held in Auckland in June in which we had a record number of 7 swimmers attend this meet. Our Team place 11<sup>th</sup> and came home with 3 Gold Medals. The majority of this team made finals, which at the pinnacle meet for New Zealand is an outstanding achievement.

### **Summary**

The results achieved throughout the year prove that although we have relatively small teams attending, they continue to achieve to an exceptionally high level. This is testament to all of the time and work they put in, it shows their continued passion, determination and commitment to swimming. ## OKATO SWIMMING CLUB – Chairpersons Report 2018/19

The season began with swimming evaluations on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> November 2018 at 5.30 to assess swimmers' ability and to form appropriate learn to swim groups for our registered swimmers. Fifty five swimmers were registered and ten volunteer instructors were sourced to teach groups. Thirty four children initially began in the widths learn to swim groups, and 21 children partook in length swimming and instruction. No swimmers swam competitively. Swimming Club night was a Thursday night beginning with one group of five year olds starting at 5pm. The other learn to swim width groups swam from 5.30 – 6pm, and length swimmers swam from 6pm-6.50pm. Around five children were placed in each group. Swimmers' ages range from five to fourteen years. We were again at our maximum capacity.

An informal discussion with Cecilie Elliot in November about the direction Okato Swimming Club was heading and my concerns that we had no swimmers wanting to compete, was most reassuring. Okato Swimming Club at this stage was meeting the needs of its members and our community and could pose as a “feeder-club” to Aquabladz in New Plymouth if some of our swimmers chose to join and compete.

The weather was kind to us, and no cancellations of club night occurred this season. We took a break over the school holidays with our last lesson being 13<sup>th</sup> December, then resuming 7<sup>th</sup> Feb when school went back.

The lessons were extremely well attended and the progression of swimmers was evident. The children enjoyed their lessons and their instructors. The lessons were well planned, fun and skills based. We also received positive feedback from parents.

This season we had some new instructors, some of whom were past competitive swimmers from this club. Liana Gifkins completed her Swim Instructor training course, of which the club financed. We are very grateful to Liana for undertaking this training.

Our relationship with the New Plymouth District Council was compromised this season. Lack of communication with our club on their part was a barrier to resolving issues regarding their unrestrained frequent use of our club's swimming equipment which they had unauthorised access to. This issue could have been dealt with in a far more positive manner. We felt taken advantage of and unsupported by the NPDC. They have however discontinued using our equipment for their paid block swimming lessons they offer at the Okato Pools throughout the summer holiday period, but provided no compensation or apology to our club.

We entered a float in the Okato Christmas Parade. It was spectacular! This was well supported by our club parents. We came fourth and won a fantastic hamper, which was then raffled with proceeds going back to the club.

A healthier option for BBQ food for club nights was decided upon and trialled this season. Silver Fern Farms donated rump steak which was then made into steak and coleslaw burgers and sold for \$3 each. These were very popular.

In February and March we held a few race nights which would help prepare the children for club champs. A new set of stop watches were purchased and parents were very willing to be time keepers. Swimmers from the width learn to swim groups were also encouraged to participate. Club champs were held over two Thursdays in mid March. Our swimmers competed well amongst each other, and many swam in every single race.

The final swimming club night was 28th March which was a Fun Night enjoyed by all, this coincided with the final week of the pool being open.

Prize giving was held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> May at Okato Rugby clubrooms with spot prizes, trophies, certificates and hot chips for the children. It was well attended.

Okato Swimming Club is entirely volunteer run with a small committee and strong supportive parent base. The 2018/19 season has been successful, busy and extremely rewarding.
